Cultural Competency Assessments and Training

- Build strategies to address the needs associated with the unique responsibilities of personnel;
- Engage target communities in meaningful ways that respect culture and promote appropriate service utilization; and
- Develop effective strategies to monitor program activities and their impact on service delivery.

Associates Work in Health Disparities

Decreasing Birth Outcome Disparities

Abt conducted a national evaluation of the Healthy Start Program, a program of the Maternal and Child Health Bureau (MCHB) committed to reducing racial and ethnic disparities in birth outcomes. This involved surveying 100 Healthy Start programs and analyzing performance measures reported annually to MCHB.

Assessing Community Progress in Addressing Health Disparities

CDC's National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion (NCCDPHP) retained Abt to evaluate an initiative of the Racial and Ethnic Health Disparities Action Institutes (REHDAI). The initiative was designed to provide training and technical assistance to communities actively addressing health disparities through the lens of health equity. The evaluation increased understanding of what REHDAI teams were able to accomplish as a result of participation and learn what factors facilitated or inhibited progress.

Identifying African-American MSM Unaware of Their HIV Status

For CDC, Abt evaluated the relative effectiveness of three strategies for identifying previously undiagnosed African-American men who have sex with men (MSM) and motivating them to be tested for HIV and linked to medical care and prevention services.

Expanding HIV Prevention Activities in Minority Serving Institutions

Abt provided technical assistance to Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Hispanic-Serving Institutions and Tribal Colleges and Universities to promote HIV awareness, testing and prevention, and responsible sexual health and harm reduction.

Expanding Mental Health Services to HIV-Positive Ethnic Minorities

Abt supports the Mental Health HIV Services Collaborative program goals of expanding mental health services for HIV-positive ethnic minorities in traditionally underserved communities and providing effective mental health services in a culturally competent manner. As the coordinating center for the program, we conduct ongoing needs assessments with the sites to identify service areas requiring improvement. We also provide technical assistance, training, and resources and work with site representatives to design programmatically and clinically meaningful evaluations at both site-specific and cross-site levels.

Making Hospitals Safer for Patients With Limited English Proficiency

Under contract to AHRQ, Abt developed a hospital guide and training module to help hospitals prevent and reduce adverse medical events for their patients with limited English proficiency. The tools—developed in collaboration with the Disparities Solutions Center at Massachusetts General Hospital—add to the government's TeamSTEPPS® program, a program designed to improve communication and teamwork skills among health care professionals.
